Other events include:

- Appropriate costumes are a must. Please note the importance of discouraging cultural misappropriation in costumes, and the need for appropriateness of costumes to be worn in our schools. Here are some additional guidelines:
- 1. **Culture is NOT Costume:** Refrain from using costumes that represent a cultural group or ethnicity.
- 2. Masks are Discouraged (Except for PPE): Wearing masks during the school day can compromise the safety of the community. We should always be identifiable in our community so we can avoid having unwelcome guests.
- 3. Awareness of Costume Appropriateness is Important: Discourage costumes that are not appropriate to the moral tone of our Catholic Schools.
- 4. **Awareness of Fear and Evil:** Be aware that Ghoulish costumes can terrify younger students, students with special needs, or students with phobias.
- 5. **We Must Be Trauma Sensitive**: There may be members of our communities who have traumas that can be triggered by certain costumes.

- Inflatable costumes are **NOT** permitted this year (Board/YRPH direction)
